#### THOUGHT FROM THE CHAIR

When you read this BirdWatch Galway members will have completed the November Inner Galway Bay count. Anyone interested in birds who have visited Nimmo's Pier or Grattan Road will realise that there are a lot of birds around from autumn until spring. The count is designed to record the numbers of wintering waterbirds (swans, ducks, geese, waders and gulls) present. This is quite an undertaking and the region from Barna all the way around to Ballyvaghan, Co. Clare, is divided into four sections for the purpose. Each section has beautiful and/or interesting spots: Barna to Oranmore has Rusheen Bay, Lough Atalia and Oranmore Bay (where large numbers of Golden Plover can be seen in late afternoon); Oranmore to Clarinbridge has Tawin island, the shore by the mud cliffs at Ballinacourty and a turlough at Ahapouleen; Clarinbridge to Aughinish the beautiful coast by the tower house on Aughinish peninsula, Traught beach and the ruined Tyrone House; Ballyvaghan to Coranroo the sandy spit known as the Rinn, the brackish lagoon Lough Muree and the Flaggy Shore. The whole area is counted once during each November, January and March, on either a Saturday or a Sunday. The different sections and all of the sub sites within them were originally defined by the late Tony Whilde and the count has been going since 1976. Data from the count were incorporated into the all-Ireland Winter Wetlands Survey, which ran for three winters from 1984/85 to 1986/87 and (since 1994/95) they have been incorporated into the Irish Wetland Bird Survey (I-WeBS). Counting the bay is a great way to get to know birds and the area itself. The committee are always happy when new counters volunteer and there are always experienced people on hand to help beginners. ## **ETHIOPIAN ENDEMICS**

For ten days in late February 2004, I was part of organised trip of five Irish and six English birders in search of endemic bird species in the Ethiopian Highlands. Although totals vary due to lumping and splitting of species, there are up to 934 species on the Ethiopian list of which we saw around 330. Most of these were new to me as it was my first time out of Ireland.

Some familiar species included Little grebes, Kestrel, Greenshank, and Black-headed Gull. Quite a few of our summer visitors were common while we were there e.g. Swallows, Swifts, Chiffchaffs, Blackcaps, etc. For me the large birds were very impressive. I saw 28 new species of raptors alone. Widespread species like Black Kites, African Fish Eagles, Augur Buzzards and Tawny Eagles always gave close and prolonged views, unlike at home. Even the wildfowl were surprisingly species rich with numerous geese and duck that were looked completely alien such as the endemic Blue-winged Goose. Some well-represented groups of birds included Vultures (six species), Doves (eleven), Kingfishers (five) and Starlings (nine).

We seemed to see different species at every spot we stopped at. The pace was often chaotic to say the least, as we were literally running from one spot to another, to see a new species for a few brief seconds before the call went up that something new was yet again found just up the track. Unfortunately a lot of species were only seen from the bus as we were often caught for time (Montagu's Harrier, Kittlitz's Plover, Woodchat Shrike, Northern Carmine Bee-eater). But if it was good enough the bus stopped and vacated in double quick time!

The highlights of the trip for myself would have to include species like Saddle-billed Stork (enormous), Verreaux's Eagle (pair soaring just over head), Marsh Sandpiper, Great Black-headed Gull, Cape Eagle Owl (with fully grown chick), Half-collared Kingfisher, African Emerald Cuckoo (colours defy description!) and Masked Shrike.

Amongst some of the mammals seen were Warthogs, Rock & Tree Hyrax, Vervets & Black and White Colobus monkeys, Olive Baboons, Abyssinian Hares Gelada Baboon and Mountain Nyala (last 3 endemics species). However the mammal highlight of the trip had to be the rare Ethiopian Wolf, seen in the Bale Mountains, just short of 4000m high. Absolutely stunning!

### **KILCUMMIN HEAD OUTING**

After an early start from Galway Cathedral on Aug 29th, five members arrived at Kilcummin at half past eight in the morning. The strong wind, which had been blowing from the southwest was forecast to veer around to the west or northwest, conditions that are optimum for seawatching at Kilcummin. There were plenty of birds to be seen on the sea, with Gannet and Fulmar common and Manx Shearwater by the hundred, but Sandwich and 'Commic' Terns, Kittiwake, Arctic Skua etc. were also noted. The best birds of the morning were a single Leach's Petrel, a number of distant Storm Petrels, 2 Pomarine Skua and last, but not least, a wonderful adult Sabine's Gull, complete with grey head and yellow-tipped bill. This bird was picked out by Dave Suddaby, who was over from his BWI duties at Belmullet for the day. After lunch at a nearby pub the party reconvened at Killala Pier, where we met three more Galway members and more than twenty from the new Mayo Branch. After enjoying some waders (including Whimbrel) at the pier, everyone headed back to the head for more seawatching. During the afternoon we saw many of the species noted before, but a feature were more than twenty Great Skua flying one by one from the east very close to the head and more than 50 Sooty Shearwater further out. Although the wind never got as far to the northwest as one might have wished, it was an enjoyable day and thanks are due to our friends in Mayo for their hospitality.
